Now everything is there all the time INCLUDING from iOS, Android or Windows. HUGE to have a secured database that transits platforms. Saved my bacon on more than one occasion when I was on the road and needed a login or a serial number. And they seem to WORK to keep it the best!! Just wanted to add my 2 cents. I knew 1 Password was a great place to store passwords, however Carolyn pointed out more capabilities and just how AgileBits is always expanding and increasing the software's capabilities. Since I started using it, I have received at least two upgrades that were at no charge - or free! Also I sat down and figured out just how secure my master password is, and literally impossible to figure out. For example, if my password was just using lower case alphabet letters, without spaces or other nonalpha characters, it's security would be 26 to the 29th power, or 26²⁹ or too many zeroes to even figure that out. I'm certain that one person at ATX will give us the name of that figure. The longer I use and read about 1 Password, the better I like the idea of using it. All of us have data and items involving bank accounts, serial numbers, passwords for our various accounts with banks, brokerage companies, and a myriad of other companies that we deal with on a daily basis.
